Distractions

Luke 10:38-42 NRSV Updated Edition

Mary, Martha, and Jesus were friends. In Luke 10:38-42, Jesus pays Martha and Mary a visit. Martha complains to Jesus that her sister Mary is not helping with the tasks at hand. Mary has instead chosen to sit at Jesus' feet and listen to his teaching. Instead of scolding Mary, Jesus tells Martha that she is distracted.

My wife and I were in a restaurant when we noticed a family of three seated at a table nearby: a mother, a Father, and a young girl about 8 years old. Both parents had their cell phones out and were distracted while the young girl sat there just staring out the window. There was no conversation, eye contact, or interaction between the parents and their daughter. It was sad that their cell phones were more important than their daughter.

How often are we distracted by work issues, cell phones, social media, television, or the radio and miss the opportunity to interact with those around us? When we pray, are we easily distracted? How often do we begin one task only to become distracted and never finish it?

My neighbor is a member of the Old Order German Baptist Brethren, one of the groups that separated from the Church of the Brethren in 1881. He explained that they had just endured a split in the church. I inquired as to the reason for the split, and he explained that they didn't believe in smartphones or the internet, as the church defined them as distractions. The group that split away was using smartphones that were connected to the internet.



I believe we need to hear Jesus' words to Martha, "you are worried and distracted by many things." We struggle to be in the moment, to listen to another, to not interrupt to make our point, or to extend care, compassion, and empathy for others in need. We struggle to pray with a clear mind and heart focused upon God when phones ring, text messages ping, and exhaustion turns into sleep.

As we journey through Lent and approach Easter, may we be vigilant in blocking out the distractions, so that we may be truly present in the moment with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ as He approaches the cross. May we be focused on being in the moment with our families, hearing them, sharing with them, and being present for them.



Early Anabaptism in Global Perspective -- Past, Present, and Future at 500 Years July 22-24, 2025

This conference marking the 500th anniversary of the birth of the Anabaptist movement will revisit early Anabaptism and give special attention to the global context in which it emerged and spread. Speakers will also consider how Anabaptist history has been received by churches and academics in more recent times and in varying contexts around the world. With more than three dozen plenary sessions, papers, seminars, and roundtables by presenters from ten countries, the conference will examine such varied themes as migration, diplomacy, the arts, colonialism, peacemaking, and theological identity. Explorations of the connections between Anabaptism and Baptist, Hutterite, Liberation Theology, Quaker, Mennonite, and Radical Pietist traditions are also on the program. Roundtable sessions and seminars include a discussion of approaches to teaching early Anabaptism and a workshop on reading early Anabaptist sources in community. Optional pre- and post-conference field trips will visit area libraries and archives and the 1719 Museum.

The encounter profoundly affects their biopsychosocial-spiritual well-being and often leads to disenfranchised grief. This interactive workshop examines three types of spiritual struggles that often occur in connection with three spiritual coping methods that can facilitate healthy adjustment. Attendees will gain skills in applying the methods to supporting congregational members navigating loss and grief using a case study.

Caring for Congregational Members at the End-of-Life Tuesday, October 7, 2025 • 9:30 AM – 12:30 PM • Zoom Only

Nearing death is as much a part of life as living. Drawing on a trifold model of terminally-ill ministry, this interactive workshop explores strategies for empowering adult congregational members at the end-of-life. Consideration of best practices in managing core ethical dilemmas persons navigate during this final lifespan stage will interweave across the discussion. A small group role-play activity provides the opportunity to apply the methods to assisting dying persons from the home to healthcare setting.
