DISTRICT MINISTER TEAM NOTES

On Saturday, June 22nd and Sunday, June 23rd, the Western PA District pastors gathered for a 6-hour ethics training, as required by the Church of the Brethren Ministry Office. This ethics training is one component of the pastors ordination review conducted every 5 years. Saturday's class was hosted by the Somerset Church of the Brethren and Sunday's class was hosted by the Uniontown Church of the Brethren. Pastor Del Keeney from Mechanicsburg presented the training.

I mention this training, as ethics are an important component of leadership. Ethics are important for each of us as we live our daily lives. God emphasized the importance of ethics when he conveyed to Moses the Ten Commandments in Exodus 19. The Ten Commandments are the foundation of Godly living. God's Ten Commandments for ethical living are found throughout many of our state and federal buildings and serve as the underpinnings of our laws today.

In Matthew 5 we read Jesus' Sermon on the Mount and The Beatitudes, again outlining the tenants of who are blessed in God's eyes, providing an additional directive for Godly living. I invite you to take a moment to reread Exodus 19 and Matthew 5 for we are all flawed and we all stray from God at times.

Ethics can be applied to various aspects of our daily lives, at home with our families, at work, in social settings, and our interaction with strangers we encounter daily. The Church of the Brethren in 1992 at the Annual Conference adopted a document titled, Ethics for Congregations. The paper was revised in 1996 and 2008 and renamed, Ethics in Ministry Relations. In 2009 at the Western PA District Conference, a query was approved to be submitted to the Annual Conference seeking a uniform denominational process by which districts might deal with a congregation that engages in questionable ethical activity. At the 2010 Annual Conference, the Standing Committee approved the W. PA District's query and sent it to a committee for review. The committee reviewed the query and reported back to the Annual Conference in 2014 with their recommendations for revisions to the 2006 Ethics in Ministry Paper. The committee proposed a new document titled, Congregational Ethics Polity, it was adopted by the Annual Conference delegates, at the 2014 Annual Conference. The QR Code or the link below will take you to the Congregational Ethics Paper.

The paper covers scriptural visions of the church, the church and its relationships, practices of awareness, assessment and accountability, the code of ethics, and recommendations for implementation of congregational ethics polity. Ethics are not just applicable to pastors, but to each of us who make up the church. I invite you to review the Congregational Ethics Polity, as it is founded in scripture, that can serve to strengthen our faith communities.




MUSEUM OF THE BIBLE

What does it mean to lead in today's church and world? The American protestant church is in steep decline. The Church of the Brethren is experiencing schism. The pandemic accelerated the already changing patterns of religious life. Resources are scarce. Furthermore, Brethren are naturally suspicious of leaders; called, elected, or self-proclaimed. Values, such as humility, consensus, and the priesthood of all believers, lead to a flat hierarchy and a communal pragmatism. We celebrate leaders such as Dan West, Sarah Major, M.R. Zigler, and Anna Mow, but in their day, they stirred controversy by the manner of their leading. So, what does it mean to lead in today's church and world? I believe leadership begins by asking the first question and having the willingness and curiosity to pursue the second question. It is a way of thinking that results in effective doing. And yes, it is something we do together.
