FROM THE DISTRICT MODERATOR

If Only All the Hands that Reach Could Touch

At District Conference I shared my thoughts for our District and I want to again challenge our churches to reach out and touch. I know that all churches have ministries and send money to our District and to Elgin for the ministries that take place within our denomination. I know that churches have other ministries too.

My challenge is for each and every one of us to provide a ministry within our District that isn't overseen by any committee or person. Each of us has a responsibility as a Christian to reach out to the lost, hungry, lonely and unchurched. This comes from Matthew 25:35-40.

We don't need a committee or someone to oversee individual plans to reach out and touch someone in your neighbor, church member, or a family member who has not been in touch with a church. All too often we fail to remember that as Christians we have a responsibility to show Christ to those who need a touch from Him.

By accident my husband and I have started meeting with a group of people. Originally, we met on occasions a local restaurant that closed. These people needed support and friendship. We now meet in the local pizza shop twice a week. We just have lunch together and have prayer for anyone in the group or someone may bring a prayer request.



Some are without work, some work and are off at that time of the day, some are retired but it doesn't matter, the important part is that we are there for each other.

Most of the group was unchurched but two have now started to attend church with us. All too often it is so easy to keep our Christianity hidden or limit what we do for others. Jesus never stopped sharing himself with those who needed him.

Therefore, as a Christian, it is important for us to be the hands and feet of Christ to those who need Jesus.

Be courageous and pray for God to direction and give you guidance in a ministry that can bring joy and love, which can lead to salvation for someone. Be that helping hand to those around you or someone you may only see occasionally.



Serving in the District and beyond

TWO FROM DISTRICT SERVE WITH CDS AT LA WILDFIRES

One may be wondering what is CDS? It is an acronym for Children's Disaster Services, a Church of the Brethren organization that serves children and families after disasters, at the request of the American Red Cross or FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency). CDS is a part of Brethren Disaster Ministries (BDM) which focuses on rebuilding homes, caring for children, and providing international relief by engaging volunteers, supporters, and partners to serve communities recovering from disaster. CDS volunteers receive specialized training to create safe spaces for children to play in shelters and resource centers. Volunteers give children individualized attention and encourage them to express

> themselves and hopefully assist with the healing process.

We were aware of CDS through our work with children's programming at the

Somerset Church of the Brethren and were very interested in participating in the training to serve with this group in the future. We

participated in CDS training in 2021 and were both approved as volunteers after receiving the necessary clearances and references. We previously volunteered with CDS at two Pittsburgh area disasters - an apartment fire and a gas explosion. Kathie was deployed to Tampa with CDS in October 2024 following Hurricane Milton. The LA Wildfire deployment was the second two-week deployment for Kathie and the first for Sherry. Our team of seven was the second one deployed to LA. Two additional teams were later deployed as well.

Our experience in Los Angeles was rewarding, educational, inspirational, fun and Friends using water colors and markers challenging. We were initially assigned to the largest shelter in Pasadena which was near the Eaton fire. Then we were assigned to a shelter in Westwood which was close to the Pacific Palisades fire. We also spent two days in the Pasadena FEMA Resource Center

where many local, state, and federal agencies were there to assist victims of the fire. At the shelters or resource center we spent time with children encouraging creative play while the adult family members visited agencies, attended to family matters, or just took a break. Our hearts were filled by the smiles and hugs we received. At the end of each day, one young friend would ask," Are you coming back tomorrow?"

Each day presented new challenges. Sometimes we had large spaces for the play area, sometimes not so large spaces that were shared with sheltered residents. The children received much needed and deserved one-on-one attention and love. Our team of volunteers was creative using boxes to make kitchen sets, roads and race tracks, and beds for dolls. Our Kit of Comfort (a suitcase of carefully selected toys for open-ended play) allowed us to offer a wide variety of activities.

We were blessed to have a wonderful, caring and loving team that included volunteers from California, South Carolina, Minnesota, and Missouri. We were Mennonite, United Methodist, Presbyterian and Church of the Brethren. We were also blessed to have volunteers with special gifts, including one volunteer who was fluent in Spanish.

Early Anabaptism in Global Perspective -- Past, Present, and Future at 500 Years July 22-24, 2025

This conference marking the 500th anniversary of the birth of the Anabaptist movement will revisit early Anabaptism and give special attention to the global context in which it emerged and spread. Speakers will also consider how Anabaptist history has been received by churches and academics in more recent times and in varying contexts around the world.

With more than three dozen plenary sessions, papers, seminars, and roundtables by presenters from ten countries, the conference will examine such varied themes as migration, diplomacy, the arts, colonialism, peacemaking, and theological identity. Explorations of the connections between Anabaptism and Baptist, Hutterite, Liberation Theology, Quaker, Mennonite, and Radical Pietist traditions are also on the program. Roundtable sessions and seminars include a discussion of approaches to teaching early Anabaptism and a workshop on reading early Anabaptist sources in community. Optional pre- and post-conference field trips will visit area libraries and archives and the 1719 Museum.

She receives joy from supporting the ministry of local congregations where the work of forming disciples and continuing the work of Jesus is most effective and meaningful. Her greatest passion is congregational ministry and equipping those who provide leadership in the local church through training and continued education.

Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center (SVMC) delivers training and continuing education for Church of the Brethren ministry and lay leadership.
