DISTRICT CONFERENCE RECAP

The delegates of the Western PA District gathered at Camp Harmony on October 19, 2024 on a lovely autumn day for the 158th Annual District Conference. The Conference Moderator Jeffery Fackler chose the theme I Chose You as the theme for this year's District Conference.

Conference was condensed into a morning business session which included a delicious brunch served by Camp Harmony. There was also a brief presentation by Nancy McCrickard from the COB Ministry and Mission Board, Ryan Braught from Part-time Pastor/Full-time Church, and a short video presentation from Eder Financial.

The Licensed Ministers of the District were consecrated by Pastor Irvin Ernst representing the District Pastor & Parish Ministry Team and certificates were presented by Donna Rhodes from Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center (SVMC). There was also a presentation from the District to Donna Rhodes for her retirement and all the work she has done in our district.

Amelia Derr from the Locust Grove COB was installed as Moderator for 2025. Others affirmed on the slate include: Moderator Designate, Abby Shaffer (Rummel); District Clerk, Ruby Mader (Rummel); Program & Arrangements, Leah Hileman (Robinson); Camp Harmony Board, Dan Shaffer, Nick Berkey, Mike Swick, and Melissa Hostetler; District Board Chair, Stephen Parfitt (Greensburg); District Leadership Team: Outreach & Service Team, Oyango Burney (Penn Run); Pastor & Parish Ministry Team, Ron Barto (Somerset); Stewards and Finance Team, Kirt Anderson (Freedom Church—Indiana).

Moderator Jeffery Fackler shared an official acknowledgement of the congregations that have left the Western PA District in 2024.

A budget of \$137,588.00 for 2024 was approved. The total reflects a \$72.00 decrease.

There were officially 93 attendees (73 delegates, 20 Non-delegates, and District Leadership and Staff) and

30 congregations were represented. Thank you for all the hygiene kits, school kits, and clean up buckets that were given for Church World Service.

THANK YOU FOR YOUR PRAYERS

Pastor Charlie Whipple would like to say a sincere thank you for all the prayers for his surgery and during his recovery. He would like to share that he is so thankful to be able to serve here in the Western PA District of the Church of the Brethren.

ARBUTUS PET FOOD PANTRY

The pet pantry is growing by leaps and bounds. In Oct. 2023 the pantry served 50 families. This past Oct. 2024 we served 110 families. Each month the pantry has been adding about 15 new families to the list of individuals who use our service. We offer food to both cats and dogs. The food is distributed in 1 gallon bags. We also offer, when available, wet canned food and treats. The pantry relies on monetary and food donations from the community as well as support from the Arbutus Church. This is one of our missions in helping those in need in the community. Since the beginning of 2024 the pantry has received 35 monetary and food donations from individuals and organizations. We are very thankful for the support that we have experienced. During inflationary times it is difficult for people to purchase food for their pets and themselves. By using the pantry their money can now be stretched to feed themselves. We have served up to 39 towns through this program. In addition to the food provided there is always a free table for clients to choose items from. Donations of pet items such as bowls, collars, leashes etc. plus household items are available to them. In November, we will offer new and slightly used blankets. Should you have any that you would like to donate they can be dropped off at the Arbutus Church.

THANKS TO EVERYONE FOR A GREAT SHOE DRIVE!

On September 18, 2024 a great group of volunteers gathered at the Westmont church to load a shipment of shoes for our funds2orgs fundraiser. In just a few minutes, they were able to load 3,775 pairs of shoes onto the truck and start them on their trip to the processing plant in Florida.

We received word last week that the shipment netted a profit of \$1,558.40 to be used to benefit the El Hogar De Ninos Enmanuel Home. The Home has recently added a culinary post-secondary curriculum to their campus, and our funds will be used to purchase commercial grade equipment needed to outfit the kitchen.

It takes many people working together to make this drive possible. Sincere thanks to the congregations and individuals across the district who collect and donate shoes to the drive; the Westmont church that generously allows us to store the shoes in their building until pick up; the volunteers who inspect, band, and bag the shoes; the packers who tag, carry and toss heavy bags of shoes onto the truck; and the district office staff for accepting donations on our behalf and storing them until they can be processed, along with handling the profit checks.

To this date, we have been able to donate a total of more than \$8,000 to the work of the Home, and have already begun collecting shoes for the next shipment. For details on becoming part of the shoe project, contact the Shoe Committee:

ABOUT THE AUTHOR







What does it mean to lead in today's church and world? The American protestant church is in steep decline. The Church of the Brethren is experiencing schism. The pandemic accelerated the already changing patterns of religious life. Resources are scarce. Furthermore, Brethren are naturally suspicious of leaders; called, elected, or self-proclaimed. Values, such as humility, consensus, and the priesthood of all believers, lead to a flat hierarchy and a communal pragmatism. We celebrate leaders such as Dan West, Sarah Major, M.R. Zigler, and Anna Mow, but in their day, they stirred controversy by the manner of their leading. So, what does it mean to lead in today's church and world? I believe leadership begins by asking the first question and having the willingness and curiosity to pursue the second question. It is a way of thinking that results in effective doing. And yes, it is something we do together.

Nominations for the 2025 AC Ballot Requested

The deadline for nominations for the Annual Conference ballot is **December 4**. The denomination depends on leaders elected at Conference from nominees proposed by the wider church. There are deliberate, purposeful steps to the process of discernment which leads to the Nominating Committee engaging in prayerful discussion of the nominees when it meets in January. The list is narrowed to four names per office which is then sent to the full Standing Committee which votes to further narrow the list to two names per office in order to create the Annual Conference ballot. It should be noted that the Review and Evaluation Committee consists of five members, therefore the Annual Conference ballot will need to consist of ten

nominees. The delegates of Annual Conference elect those who will finally serve.

We are grateful for the excellent nominations already submitted, but additional names are needed! The offices that are open for 2025 are the following: Moderator Elect, Program & Arrangements Committee, Mission & Ministry Board from Area 1 (ANE, Mid-Atlantic, MPA, SPA, WPA), Mission & Ministry Board from Area 4 (MO/ARK, NPL, SPL, WPL), Pastoral Benefits and Compensation Advisory Committee-Laity, and Review and Evaluation Committee. Detailed information regarding these positions is available at https://www.brethren.org/ac/nominations.

Pray over these open positions and let the Spirit lift in your heart names of people you know who might fill these roles. You can nominate them using the simple form on the nominations webpage. Be sure to contact the person you have nominated and let them know why you think their gifts qualify them for the role and encourage them to agree to take the next step in filling out the nominee information form on the Annual Conference website.

If you have been nominated and have not yet accepted, we encourage you to prayerfully discern your possible call and willingness to serve the church in this way. Then fill out the nominee information form and return it so you will be included in the pool of candidates who will be considered for the ballot in 2025. That form indicates your acceptance to be considered.

Have you had interest and a sense of call to serve in one of the roles that are open? Talk to someone who knows you and test that sense. If affirmed, ask that person or another to nominate you!

As we seek a range of candidates who represent the whole church, we pay particular attention to the Call for Accountability in order to include our diversity in terms of age, race/ethnicity, gender, and theology.

Thank you so much for participating in this important process! The Annual Conference office is receiving nominations until **December 4, 2024**.


Please keep those in the path of Hurricane Milton in your prayers, including our sisters and brothers in Church of the Brethren churches and their communities.


HURRICANE RESPONSE UPDATES

Churches of the Brethren in Florida have not experienced serious damage from Hurricane Milton, reports Beth Sollenberger, director of administration for Atlantic Southeast District. "We've now heard from all the ASE congregations and all are doing well," she said. "No building damage reported although there are some downed trees and many are without power. We are feeling blessed and pray for those in Milton's path who did not fare so well."

Brethren Disaster Ministries works to help coordinate response with districts

Staff of Brethren Disaster Ministries continue to work with district leaders to help coordinate response efforts including the collection and distribution of relief materials and donations for emergency funding especially for the hardest-hit areas in Southeastern District.

Church World Service distributes thousands of disaster kits, offers support to survivors in wake of hurricanes

Church World Service (CWS) is sharing updated kit distribution numbers and information about relief efforts following on the recent hurricanes.

To date, CWS has coordinated the shipment of 4,372 Clean-Up Buckets, 8,720 Hygiene Kits, 5,890 blankets, 1,205 Menstrual Hygiene Kits, 590 School Kits, and 72 Welcome Backpacks to partners in Florida and North Carolina (a value of more than \$561,000) while working with various groups that are assembling kits and establishing temporary depots. 
Iglesia de los Hermanos (IHRD), Church of the Brethren in the Dominican Republic

Church of the Brethren in Rwanda

The recent government closure of churches in Rwanda is affecting many small church-related schools, including ours. The September reopening of school at the Brethren Academy was delayed but is finally back in session. Pray for the teachers and children at the nursery school, that much learning and joyful fellowship will fill the school term. Pray that the Church of the Brethren congregations in Rwanda will quickly be able to meet the exacting building standards imposed on them by the government and that they will be able to return to their places of worship very soon. Prayers of thanksgiving for their ingenuity and faith in finding alternate

worship places in their communities with some traveling as much as 2 hours one way to participate in worship in the church building in Gisenyi.

South Sudan, a Church of the Brethren Mission Project

Pray for relief from the extreme impacts of climate change in South Sudan There have been unrelenting floods where once there was drought. The land can no longer absorb the rain water. More than 2,864 households have been destroyed and 18,178 people have been displaced by floods in Lafon County, Eastern Equatoria State, north of Torit. This is an area where one of the emerging congregations of the Church of the Brethren is located.

Ecuador, a partner agency

Ecuador is a country where Church of the Brethren has ongoing agricultural projects, including through GFI partner Fundación Brethren y Unida (FBU). Beginning in mid-September the government implemented daily electrical outages and water rationing across multiple provinces in response to severe drought and an energy crisis. The crisis was triggered in response to impacts on the generation of hydroelectric power. Pray that hese measures prove to be helpful in managing the crisis and that the people may remain peaceful and have confidence in their government during these difficult days.


