After weeks of collecting and some long days of sorting, we opened our doors on Saturday, August 17 for our annual clothing giveaway! Thanks to Facebook advertising, we had about double the donations of last year, and we had to expand into the classrooms. We even had a whole room just for men's big and tall!

We also had about twice the people who came to get free clothes. We estimate around 275 kitchen-size garbage bags went out - around 90% of what we offered was taken!

Some moms had tears in their eyes, and many couldn't believe it was all free. Lots of folks from the community were happy to donate, and glad their items could help people directly, instead of going through Goodwill.

We are sad that so many are in need around us, but so thankful that God allows us to help!

What does it mean to lead in today's church and world? The American protestant church is in steep decline. The Church of the Brethren is experiencing schism. The pandemic accelerated the already changing patterns of religious life. Resources are scarce. Furthermore, Brethren are naturally suspicious of leaders; called, elected, or self-proclaimed. Values, such as humility, consensus, and the priesthood of all believers, lead to a flat hierarchy and a communal pragmatism. We celebrate leaders such as Dan West, Sarah Major, M.R. Zigler, and Anna Mow, but in their day, they stirred controversy by the manner of their leading. So, what does it mean to lead in today's church and world? I believe leadership begins by asking the first question and having the willingness and curiosity to pursue the second question. It is a way of thinking that results in effective doing. And yes, it is something we do together.


